Admission

Admission is open to all on a first come first serve cum merit basis. We are enthusiastic in admitting students from diverse cultural social, economic, ethnic, and geographical backgrounds.

Criteria for Admission:

Students who have passed plus 2 (10+2) in their respective stream or an equivalent examination from a recognized Board in India or abroad which is considered as equivalent by the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) shall be eligible for admission into the first semester of Four Year Under Graduate Programme (Honours Degree Course)

Students who have passed 10+2 or an equivalent examination from any stream from a recognised Board in India/Abroad have the option to change to Arts stream.

A Student, who has appeared for the qualifying examination (10+2) level and is awaiting the results, is also eligible to apply for admission in different courses, subject to fulfilment of criteria.

Application form, complete in all respects along with relevant document(s), Mark sheet(s), Certificate(s) etc

Should be submitted to the office of CHRIST COLLEGE, Umeit, Ri-Bhoi District, Shillong-793103, Meghalaya State

Within a week after the receipt of Mark sheet(s) of Class 12th or equivalent Examination.

Incomplete applications received after the last date will not be entertained. Any student providing incorrect, false or misleading information in the application form shall forfeit his /her admission to the College.

There will be a personal interview for the shortlisted candidates.

- Prospectus and Application Form may be obtained from the College Office from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on notified working days, on payment of Rs.500/- (Five hundred only).

Attendance

Attendance is compulsory. Students having less than 75% of attendance are liable to be debarred from Examinations. Any student who is absent for one month will be liable to have his/her name removed from the College Registers. Fresh Admission Fees will have to be paid if the student is allowed to join back.

Assessment of Students

Continuous assessment of the students is done by the college through regular tests, projects and assignments. There will be sessional tests and internal assessment tests. If a student does not pass he/she may be debarred from appearing in the End Semester Examinations. The marks secured by the students at these assessment tests are taken into consideration at the time of registering the students for University Examinations. The Examination Committee's decision in this regard is final and binding. Projects, study tours and field works are essential requirements of a number of degree programmes





Library

The College maintains a well-stocked, computerized library, containing different sections devoted to each subjects. The college also subscribes to a number of journals on various subjects. The library has a reference section, which houses the journals encyclopaedias, past question papers of the university and other books which are available only for reference purposes. The reading room attached to the library subscribes to journals, magazines and newspapers, both regional and national and also international. The library also houses the internet facility over a number of networked computers which is available to the students during library hours. Students are encouraged to augment classroom learning by using the knowledge-based available on the internet. On all working days, the college Library will remain open from 09:00 a.m. to 5:00. p.m. Students are requested to take advantage of the facilities provided.

Dress Code

The following code should be adhered to:

- Hair should be combed and tidy. Long hair is not allowed for boys.
 - Semi-formal/formal footwear is to be worn. Bathroom slippers are not allowed.
 - T-shirts / Jackets, etc., when worn, should not have abusive or other objectionable language/pictures printed on them.
 - Boys must wear full-length trousers.
 - Boys' shirts / T-shirts must either be half-sleeved or full-sleeved.
 - Girls' blouses should be sleeved and fall well below the waistline, be modestly cut and not transparent.
 - Girls may not wear half or mid-length pants. Girls' dresses/skirts must be of a length which maintains modesty. Face rings, nose rings and lip rings are not to be worn.
 - Boys are not allowed to wear earrings.
 - Caps must not be worn in classrooms and should otherwise be removed deferentially when greeting a member of the Staff. Woollen caps may be worn during winter and when religious purposes require the shaving of the head.
- College uniforms will be mandatory from the second month of the First Semester.
The Colour and the pattern of the uniform will be given at the time of admission.

General rules and conduct

1. Students are expected to conduct themselves/ maintain discipline in and outside the College governed by the rules and regulations of the College.
2. All students are expected to dress modestly as prescribed above.
3. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited.

- 1) Students shall occupy the place allotted to them in the hostel.
- 2) All arrangements should be made with the permission of the warden
- 3) Students should refrain from any wastage of food.
- 4) Silence should be maintained from 8.30 pm to next day 7.30 am (frequent movements during study hours)
- 5) During silence period do not visit friends room
- 6) Hostellers are not allowed to go out without the permission of the warden
- 7) Hostellers are not allowed to use any electronic items without the permission of the warden
- 8) Strictly prohibited hosting birthday celebrations at midnight
- 9) Hostellers shall not enter the kitchen or give orders to the cooks. Complaints if any, shall be brought to the notice of the warden
- 10) All cases of illness must be reported immediately to the warden, hostellers will have to pay for their own medical expenses.
- 11) Catholic students will consider participation of Holy Mass daily, other students of other religious denominations are free to attend the Holy Mass
- 12) Bringing dayscholars/
friends from outside/guests are not allowed in the hostel.
- 13) Using of mobile phones are allowed in the hostel only during the stipulated time.
- 14) Kindly switch off the lights and fans when you go out of your rooms
- 15) Bathing hours: 5 am to 8.30 am and 4 pm to 7 pm
- 16) Each hosteller must personally sign in the movement register when you go out after getting the permission from the warden.
- 17) Hostel fees should be paid before 5th of every month.
